PPP LOAN

The Church Council asked me to "look into & apply" for a PPP (Paycheck Protection Program) loan through the SBA due to Covid-19.

A loan to Emanuel Lutheran Church was approved by the SBA in the amount of



\$15,593. It is a two (2) year loan at 1% interest rate. The loan is "forgivable" if at least 75% is used for payroll and the remaining 25% used for utilities within twenty-four (24) weeks.

Emanuel will be able to use 100% of the loan for payroll within the allotted time period.

This is a "win-win" situation for Emanuel Lutheran Church.

The meeting was called to order at 7:07 p.m. by President Mike Winter. Charles Kemmish gave devotions.

Council Agenda:

- Motion by John Spilde, seconded by Jane Anderson, to approve the secretary minutes for the meeting of May 18, 2020. Approved.
- Motion by Alan Ellis, seconded by Matt Solon to approve the Consolidated Funds Report. Approved.
- Motion by Jane Anderson, seconded by Alan Ellis to approve the Treasurear's Report. Approved.
- Motion by Matt Solon, seconded by Alan Ellis, to approve the Capital and Building Accounts Report. Approved.
- Motion by John Spilde, seconded by CharLes Kemmish to approve the Memorial Fund Report. Approved.
- Motion by John Spilde, seconded by Alan Ellis, to approve the pastor taking vacation time from July 6 – July 12, 2020. Approved. Pastor Michells from Bethany will preside over the service on July 7.
- Motion by Alan Ellis, seconded by CharLess Kemmish to approve the Property Committee Report. Approved.

- No other committee reports were available.
- Pastor was to check to see if we had received our refund from the canceled assembly meeting.
 - A lengthy discussion was held about reopening the church. There were concerns about what safety precautions would be taken when and if the church is reopened. The church secretary will be asked to email as many members that have email addresses asking for input and to request input in the newsletter. No decision was made as to when indoor church services would be held and we will continue to have outdoor services until indoor services begin.
- Matt Solon reported that the Paycheck Protection Program money had been deposited into the checking account.
- Discussion was held concerning appointing a new board member to replace Alex Skovgaard.
 Names were mentioned and a final decision will be made at the July meeting.
- John Spilde provided information regarding the Prayer Chain.
- Discussion was held about communion distribution when indoor services begin.
- Discussion was held concerning bequests by the Rudolph and Elizabeth Miller Charitable Trust. Awaiting a response from the finance committee.
- Motion by Alan Ellis, seconded by Matt Solon, to adjourn. Approved.

LSI collaborates with the individuals we serve and the contracted mentors to ensure each match is the perfect fit and create a shared living opportunity that is beneficial to mentors and mentees. With the extra safety precautions associated with COVID-19, this program is a safe option where participants are in a home setting, interacting with one trusted mentor instead of several staff members.

Ramblings from the Back Corner





Dolly Parton once said, "Storms make trees take deeper roots." Incredibly good point. We do not see the roots, but they are there, supporting the tree above it.

During July many of the hymns included in our worship are about sowing or scattering seeds. As every farmer and gardener knows, putting the seeds in the ground is not the first step in producing a crop. The soil must be made ready first, otherwise that poor seed will not make it. It will sprout and wither.

During a plant's lifetime there are stressors that affect it like wind, drought, excessive heat, floods, insects, disease, or lack of nutrients in the soil. Some of those stressors can deepen the roots or increase stalk strength. There are others that will decrease the harvest or kill the plant. Gardeners tend to their plants to decrease the stressors, to make them stronger and more fruitful.

As we remember the words to these hymns, "Lord, Let My Heart Be Good Soil", "On What Has Now Been Sown", "We Plow the Fields and Scatter", and "For the Fruit of All Creation", let's pray and be thankful that God is giving us deeper roots and supporting us during our physical distancing.




