## A Post from the Pastor

Greetings!



As I write this we find ourselves in another time in between. Our governor has lifted COVID restrictions and mandates—some say too soon, some say not soon enough, but we can all agree it's confusing. Just what is happening with the pandemic? Or is it an endemic now?

Then the war in the Ukraine...Kyrie eleison. Pandemonium, chaos, conflict, the threat of nuclear weapons, people fighting in the streets...We all can agree it's not only confusing, but alarming as well.

In a world such as this we prepare and enter into Lent. And Lent can be another type of in between time—that liminal space between Ash Wednesday and Easter, a time of letting go, of growing still, and listening. This Lent we're going to try out a new practice. In front of the altar you'll see 6 purple pillar candles—one for each week of Lent. On Ash Wednesday all 6 candles will be lit. Each week one less will be lit, symbolizing of what we let go of to make more space for God. The final candle will be extinguished on Maundy Thursday at the stripping of the altar.

If you would like to do a similar practice in your home, you can use candles or even a pretty bowl filled with smooth stones. Put these items in your prayer corner and each time you go to spend a little time with God, light one less candle or take a stone out of your bowl and think about what you'd like to let go of.

Lent is not only a time to let go of unhelpful habits and thoughts but it can also be a time to do something more, a new practice or a new habit. Here at Emanuel we'll be looking at the suggestions from our roundtable discussions during Stewardship Month and see how we can put them into practice. We've already started with a Help/Wants board in the entryway. If you need help or assistance fill out a slip with the information and your phone number and put it on the board. Someone who would like to help will then contact you to make arrangements.

It was so fantastic to celebrate Mardi Gras together! Many people told me they felt encouraged and invigorated to see so many folks here all having a great time. It makes me hopeful for our future together going forward. If you feed them they will come!

## Mobile Pantry Help

Story Street Pantry is a nonprofit 501 (c)(3) organization which was created to unify the efforts of the Our Saviors Lutheran Food and Pet Food Pantry (Council Bluffs), the Carter Lake Community Presbyterian Food and Pet Food Pantry (Carter Lake), Riverside Food Pantry (Oakland), and the San Andres Lutheran Food **Pantry** (Omaha), and to develop new partnerships and programs to reach underserved populations and fulfill our shared mission to offer healthy, nutritious food at no cost to people in need, while always treating our clients with the highest level of dignity and respect.

Last year, Story Street Mobile Pantry served 89,000 people with 1.4 Million pounds of food in Council Bluffs alone. The Mobile Pantry partnered with the

Municipal Housing Authority to help those in need at 5 Senior Apartments. One person was packing up orders for all five Senior



Apartments and then delivering them. As the Mobile Pantry continues to grow, they are in need of Emanuel's big hearts. We will fill all the orders and the Executive Director of Story Street Pantry will be delivering them.

We hope to have two different assembly lines going at the same time. ## March is National Professional Social Work Month



March is National Professional Social Work Month, a time to recognize social workers and thank them for all they do. At Lutheran Services in Iowa (LSI), we are grateful for

Maybe you have never had a social worker involved in your life. Yet, whether you realize it or not, you have had the benefit of their behind-the-scenes work in your community. Social workers help people help themselves by overcoming life's most difficult circumstances or managing challenges of everyday living: poverty, abuse, mental illness, depression, addiction, disability, and many other situations.

#### Helping Kids Thrive

Janey was transitioning from elementary school to junior high, and she was experiencing anxiety about the big jump. She was worried about meeting new kids and new teachers, and she would have panic attacks whenever her mom would wake her up for school. Last year, when kids across the state were already feeling added stress and pressure, she missed weeks of school at a time.

Her family knew she needed extra encouragement and a shoulder to lean on. They found it through LSI Behavioral Health Intervention Services (BHIS), which provide in-home programming for lowa children and teens with severe emotional or behavioral disorders. Through the programming, families can practice developing skills like healthy communication, anger management, and problem solving.

Through LSI's BHIS programming, Janey was able to build coping skills to help her calm down and avoid overthinking worst-case scenarios about her school day. With her LSI worker, she practiced relationship skill-building - how to build friendships and stay away from others who could make school time hard.

After working on these skills multiple times each week, Janey was able to succeed in her classes. She went from failing several classes due to missing school to recently receiving a certificate showing she was on the honor roll.
