# Periodic Pastoral Ponderings

(From a guy who likes alliteration a lot)

Dear partners in mission and service,

Do you long for a change in your life? Do you crave a deeper experience of faith? Do you wish for a fuller sense of meaning and purpose as you follow Jesus in your daily life? Do you long to be open to Jesus and to others in your experience of faith, hope and love? Lent is the time when we focus our faith on growing deeper and stronger in our

walk with Jesus and our love for our neighbor.

The season of Lent begins this year with Ash Wednesday on February 14<sup>th</sup> and ends with Maundy Thursday on March 29<sup>th</sup>. The term "Lent" comes from the Old English word "lencten" and refers to the lengthening days of spring. Since the earliest days of the Christian movement, Lent has been a time of final preparation for adults who desired to be baptized and a time of intense reflection for those already baptized.

The season is forty days long (excluding the Sundays, which are regarded as "little Easter's"). "Forty" is an important biblical number. The ancient Hebrews spent forty years in the wilderness preparing for new life in the Holy Land after their rescue from slavery in Egypt. Jesus spent forty days in the wilderness re-living this preparation and being tempted by Satan. Christians remember Jesus' testing and spend this time reflecting on our brokenness and mortality and preparing once again to hear the Good News of Easter.

We begin the journey on Ash Wednesday as we are marked with a cross of ashes. You can come for worship that day at either 12 or 7 p.m. in our worship center. In the weeks following, our Wednesday services will have a special focus to lead us through our Lenten spiritual journey. Our midweek worship experiences will center around the theme, "Open My Life, Lord." We will pray for the Holy Spirit to open our eyes, our hands, our ears, our hearts, and our lives to Jesus and to our neighbor. Each week at midweek worship a member of our Emanuel community will share what it means to live a life open to Jesus and neighbor. You won't want to miss this powerful and personal sharing.

Wednesday evenings during Lent will begin with a supper served by one of our congregational groups or committees. A freewill offering will be accepted at the meals. At 6:45 p.m. children can go upstairs for Kidz Kamp activities, games, Bible study, music and prayer. Our worship begins at 7 p.m. in the worship center and will conclude about 7:45 p.m., at the same time that Kidz Kamp will conclude. We can use volunteers to assist with Kidz Kamp. If that interests you, please talk to me or to Brenda Hennigs.

Our Sunday services will focus on Jesus' journey to the cross and through that death into Resurrection. I hope you will take advantage of BOTH worship opportunities in order to get the maximum growth benefit out of this important season of the Church year. I look forward to seeing a lot of you in the next few months!


#### Vacation Bible School

#### Emanuel Evangelical Lutheran Church Council Minutes for 01/15/2017

The meeting was called to order at 7:03 p.m. by President Rosie Spangenberg

<u>Devotions</u>: Judi Malloy

#### Council Agenda:

- Motion by Bob Vergamini, seconded by Connie Solon to approve the secretary minutes for December 18, 2017 after changing page 2 to say "There have been 59 pledges so far which is 7% ahead of last year's total instead of 70%." Approved.
- Motion by Judi Malloy, seconded by Elaine Sasso to approve the Financial Secretary (Consolidated Fund) report. This included approval of transfers highlighted in a separate 2017 transfer report provided by Connie Solon. Approved.
- Motion by Bob Vergamini, seconded by Stephen Lewis to approve the Treasurer's Report. Approved.
- Motion by Elaine Sasso, seconded by Bob Vergamini to make the 2017 transfers as per the recommendation of the finance committee. Approved.
- Motion by Connie Solon, seconded by Bob Vergamini to approve the Capital Fund Report. Approved.
- Motion by Judi Malloy, seconded by Connie Solon to approve the Memorial Fund Report. Approved.
- Rick Stone appeared on behalf of the Finance Committee indicating the 2017 budget was \$159,075, but only \$156,193 was spent. One hundred sixty-six thousand seven hundred ninety-one dollars (\$166,791) has been pledged for 2018 which includes \$11,223 carryover from 2017. The proposed budget for 2018 is \$169,088

which is an increase of 8%.

- Motion by Bob Vergamini, seconded by Judi Malloy to approve the budget proposed by the Finance Committee. Approved.
- Church Council wishes to show its appreciation to the Finance Committee for its' many hours of work in preparing the budget.
- Pastor Hennigs presented a 14 point report. Rick Stone and John Burns have had a conversation with Availa Bank. Emanuel has been approved for a \$300,000 loan amortized over 20 years. Emanuel is given the choice of a five year fixed interest rate at 5.50% or a three year fixed interest rate at 5.20%. At the end of the term for the fixed rate, the loan and interest rate would be renegotiated. During construction of the daycare, Emanuel would pay interest only for six months, then automatically converting to a permanent loan with monthly principal and interest payments of \$2,065 (five year option) or \$2,025 (three year option). The loan origination fee would be \$800. An information sharing session with the congregation will be held on January 21 during Fellowship Time. Pastor also encouraged us to attend the upcoming Synod Leadership Event on February 10 in Carroll, Iowa, leaving Emanuel at 7 a.m. and returning at approximately 5:30 p.m. The Western Iowa Synod Assembly will be held from June 8-10 at the convention center in Sioux City. We can register two lay voting members for the assembly. Pastor also indicated that he wanted to attend the Comprehensive Bereavement Skills Training through the Center for Loss and Life Transition in Fort Collins, Colorado from April 9 to April 12, 2018. The cost would come from the conference and seminars budget line and the funds are already budgeted in that line. He also asked to take a vacation from April 13 to April 16.
- Motion by Suzanne Winter, seconded by Bob Vergamini to approve the Pastor attending the bereavement training in Fort Collins, Colorado from April 9 to April 12 and approving a vacation to be taken April 13 to April 16, 2018. Approved.
- Pastor reminded us that in 2012 the average weekly attendance was 70. In 2017, the average weekly attendance was 124, which is an increase of 77%. In 2011, our Synod Benevolence

was \$5,030 and in 2018 it is projected to be \$8,700, an increase of 73%.

- Stephen Lewis gave the Youth & Children's Ministry report and reported that the Christmas program and New Year's event were a great success and that Santa Claus was well received at the Angel Tree Christmas party.
- Bob Vergamini gave a report from the Property Committee regarding the hanging of pictures and artwork. Bob and Alan Ellis are preparing some criteria to be followed regarding what pictures or art will be displayed.
- Suzanne Winter gave a report from Wider Ministries. Their last meeting was January 14, 2018 where they reviewed the fall activities and passed around thank you notes for the Thanksgiving baskets, Lutheran Service gift bags and Angel Tree Christmas Party. The next project will be getting the backpacks ready for the kids going to Lakeview Camp, the Angel Tree Camp. For the Joyful Noise offering for February they are hoping that Lakeview Camp will send a representative. For March, they are expecting YES (Youth Emergency Services). They also discussed promoting recycling in the church and encouraging members to recycle. They talked about the youth selling compact reusable bags and also discussed using glassware instead of disposable containers for coffee during the fellowship hour. Earth Day is April 22 and the committee is hoping to promote that day at church. They also discussed how they could encourage participants at the food pantry to bring their own bags.
- Rosie Spangenberg gave the Worship and Music report. The committee discussed the purchase of more wireless mics for our current system and taking an inventory of our current banners. We are reminded that the Jonathan Rundman concert will be held September 22-23, 2018 sponsored by the Worship and Music Committee. They hope that they can obtain a Thrivent grant for up to \$250. Tickets will sell for \$15 a person. Elaine Sasso is attempting to start up a bell choir and she will distribute flyers to kids Wednesday night with hopes of getting organized in the next week.
- Elaine Sasso has been working with Alan Ellis concerning the outside sign. The current sign measures 12' x 5'6" and they have contacted Omaha Neon and Sandau Brothers for more information. The price for a new sign would be \$10,000-\$12,000, but the cost would be much

less if we use the current sign.

- Motion by Elaine Sasso, seconded by Bob Vergamini to make February 25, 2018 New Member Sunday. Approved.
- The board wants to draft a new cancellation policy for when and who would be responsible for canceling a regularly scheduled service because of weather or other reasons. The council directed the council secretary to draft a proposed policy.
- Warren Johnson has contacted Judi Malloy about checking church records regarding Swedish ancestry. Motion by Suzanne Winter, seconded by Connie Solon to allow Warren Johnson to photograph existing church records while being supervised by a church council member or church staff as long as this is at no cost to Emanuel. Approved.
- Motion by Suzanne Winter, seconded by Connie Solon to adjourn at 9:02 p.m. Approved.
- All reports presented to the council may be viewed by any church member at the church office

The next meeting with be after the Annual Meeting on January 28, with the next regular meeting, February 19, 2018 at 7 p.m.

And I'm trying hard to learn.


Sometime in the dead of winter
