A Post from the Pastor

Hello Dear Friends! By the time you read this we'll be coming to the end of Lent and anticipating the celebration of Easter. We have cleared a space within ourselves, our days, and our environment for God to fill with new life. We also find ourselves coming to a place of new life within our church. While I don't believe we'll ever be able to return to things as they were two years ago; I believe we continue to create and experience new normal.

I'm happy to share that starting Easter Sunday we will have more options for receiving communion. Pre filled communion sets will still be available and with the ushers as you come into church. We will also offer communion at the communion rail and you may stand or kneel as you feel comfortable. If you cannot physically come to the rail you may alert your usher that you would desire communion or you may use a prefilled set.

This means we'll need folks to volunteer as communion assistants and our ushers will also be passing the collection plate at the offering. I also want to encourage folks if you have any prayers you'd like to share with the congregation to write them on the back of your attendance slip. If you have a need or concern that you'd like to share with me privately you can indicate that on your slip as well. I will then follow up with you individually as appropriate.

We'll be adding to our liturgy with more singing, and Scripture readings. At the passing of the peace you may share the peace in whatever ways feels most comfortable for you—a handshake, a hug, or exchanging a peace sign, whatever feels natural for you.

As we move forward into the future, if another variant emerges that calls for more precautions we will adjust our service and our gathering together accordingly.

But for now I'm so happy to celebrate all of Emanuel's Easter traditions with you! We'll have an early service, Easter breakfast between services, an Easter egg hunt for the kids, and we will all join in a hearty Alleluia!

According to the most recent lowa Department of Human Services data, 10,539 lowa children were subject to abuse or neglect. The most common forms of abuse included denial of critical care, physical injury, exposure to illegal drugs or dangerous substance, and sexual abuse.

Creating Bright Futures

When Makenzey found out she was pregnant, she felt nervous and overwhelmed at the thought of being a first-time mom. She didn't know what to expect, but she wanted to create the best life for her child. While she was pregnant, Makenzey enrolled in a local service that provides free housing to expecting moms. Through the organization, she learned about LSI Early Childhood Services. With support and guidance from her LSI Parent Educator, Hannah, Makenzey prepared for a healthy birth and transition into motherhood.

"Being a new mom was really scary for me. I had no idea what I was doing," Makenzey says. "I needed to learn the basics."

Since Makenzey welcomed her daughter, Maleigha, she has since found a job she loves and saved enough money to find a home for her new family. Through it all, Hannah provided check-ins with Makenzey, introducing her to important reeducational materials, and appropriate toys and activities to ensure Maleigha hit all her developmental milestones.

"Especially when you're a first-time mom, you'll have a lot of questions. I don't have a ton of support right now, but Hannah helped me and answered every question I had about being a mom," Makenzey says. "LSI has been a really helpful service."
