## Periodic Pastoral Ponderings

(From a guy who likes alliteration a lot)

Dear friends in Christ,

Do you want to know your Bible better? I hope so. We can't manage that all at once. Studying the Bible is like eating an elephant. It's only possible one bite at a time.

The bite we will take this summer is Paul's Letter to the Ephesians. Sections of that letter appear in the appointed lectionary readings for several Sundays in June and July. Rather than read a few snippets from this great letter, I want to read and celebrate it paragraph by paragraph and in that way come to a deeper appreciation of this important New Testament document.

I hope you will take the time to read through the whole letter at least once and perhaps several times. In our worship we used the New Revised Standard Version of the Bible as our translation. However, you might want to read it in another translation for better understanding. I would encourage you to look at a translation called *The Message*. This translation was produced by Eugene Petersen and is very readable. You can find that translation online at https://www.biblestudytools.com/msg/ephesians/. Another very readable translation is N. T. Wright's Kingdom New Testament. You can find that for purchase in bookstores or online.

I will publish a daily reading guide if you want to read Ephesians a few verses at a time through the summer. That's another way to dive deeper into this great piece of faithful theology. I hope that when you have questions about this text you will post them on our Facebook page, email me, call me or find some time for us to visit face to face.

The Bible is not an encyclopedia or a recipe book or a roadmap. It is the amazing story of God's love for you and for the whole cosmos--a love so deep and so daring that God would rather die than let you go. The Letter to the Ephesians celebrates that love in Jesus and our life empowered by the Holy Spirit. I hope you will give yourself to this letter and allow the Spirit to fill you with the fullness of God.

Ephesians contains one of the great benedictions in the New Testament. That benediction is my prayer for us all. "Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, for ever and ever. Amen." May your reading and prayers be blessed with such abundance.

## Your Help Is Needed



We need several supplies for VBS and also have a lot of props and decorations that we would like to have people help with yet. We may schedule a VBS work day in early July to work on some of the larger projects. Please let me know if you would like to help with this so we can try to schedule a time when most people can make it.

Many of the supplies we need can be bought locally, but some do need to be purchased online. Certificates for Menards, Dollar Tree, Oriental Trading, Walmart or any of the grocery stores would be greatly appreciated. These would be used for the set design, games, crafts, dinner and snack.

Here are some of the items we will need for VBS. This is not a complete list, but would give us a good start on supplies:

- 1 gallon plastic milk/water jugs (18, please wash prior to brining in)
- Empty 16 oz. water bottles (24)
- Quart size resalable bags (approximately 150)
- Gallon size resalable bags (approximate 40)
- Wet wipes
- Paper plates
- Paper Towels
- Pool Noodles (10)
- Extra long sturdy rope (think tug of war)
- Small traffic cones (4)
- Clear or light colored marbles
- Fake Flower Leis (12)
- Plastic play food (fruit and veggies)
- Regular size beach balls (6)
- Extra large size beach ball
- Spray bottles (4)
- Ping pong balls (24)
- Paper grocery bags
- Large disposable plastic cups
- 3 oz plastic cups
- Medium buckets
- 5 gallon bucket
- 10 lb bag of birdseed

#### Emanuel Evangelical Lutheran Church Council Minutes for 05/21/2018

The meeting was called to order at 6:59 p.m. by President Rosie Spangenberg

**Devotions**: Elaine Sasso

#### Council Agenda:

- Alan Ellis gave the council a report concerning his investigation into changing the church sign on the east lawn of the church property. He is investigating changing it to an electronic sign. He has bids ranging from just over \$20,000 to more than \$40,000. The council appreciated his presentation, asked him to do further research and took no formal action.
- Motion by Connie Solon, seconded by Joel Hauschild to approve the secretary minutes for the previous meeting with the correction that Elaine Sasso made the motion to approve the Memorial Fund, not Peggy Jarrell, as Peggy Jarrell did not attend the meeting. Approved.
- Motion by Elaine Sasso, seconded by John Spilde to approve the Financial Secretary (Consolidated Fund) report. Approved.
- Motion by Joel Hauschild, seconded by Valarie Weelborg to approve the Treasurer's Report. Approved.
- Motion by Connie Solon, seconded by Joel Hauschild to approve the Capital Fund Report. Approved.
- Motion by John Spilde, seconded by Joel Hauschild to approve the Memorial Fund Report. Approved.
- There was discussion concerning the Wednesday Night Dinner Balance Fund shown on the Consolidated Fund Report, but no action taken.
- Pastor Hennigs gave a 15 point report. The Thursday Adult Study on spiritual gifts will continue through May. It has been very successful. He will continue to offer a communion service on the fourth Monday of each month at Midlands Living Center. Twenty-four attended the service on April 30. Pastor also gives at least one Wednesday

- afternoon a month at Bethany for Vespers Service and in April, he served on the 25<sup>th</sup>. The Construction Committee is now meeting with the architect and beginning the bid process for the daycare. The Western Iowa Synod Assembly will be held from June 8 through June 10 and so far only Pastor Hennigs is planning to go. If there are persons who can only attend for a day or two, that would be fine and it should be noted that registration and lodging costs are paid for by Emanuel Lutheran Church. Others are encouraged to notify Pastor if they can attend. Mental Health Ministry Sunday was held on May 20. It was very successful and 65 people participated in kickball. The congregation learned a great deal about Mosaic.
- Stephen Lewis prepared a written report for the Children's/Youth Ministry. He reported that the Eagle Scout project that was to be completed by Quinton Birkhoffer, which included striping of the upper parking lot, will now be completed by Matthew Honig since Quinton has aged out of scouts. The report included calendar planning for the months of April through December. Lutheran Lakeside Day Camp at Emanuel will begin June 11 through June 14.
- Motion by Elaine Sasso, seconded by John Spilde authorizing Matthew Honig to take over the Eagle Scout project and that the cost for supplies, that the church pays, be paid out of the building and grounds portion of the Capital and Building Account and that Oscar Over is authorized to sign any required scout papers for the project. Approved.
- Pastor Hennigs reports that he made a grant application to the Iowa Childcare Resource and Referral and Emanuel will receive \$19,957.70 as a grant toward the daycare project.
- Motion by Elaine Sasso, seconded by Amy Garreans to appoint John Spilde as Scout Liaison. Approved.
- Joel Hauschild gave a report from the Property Committee. The City Engineer's Office refuses to approve the re-sloping of the northeast corner of the church property next to and west of Indian Creek to make it easier to mow. The City Engineer claims that the project would result in additional pressure against the Indian Creek wall. The church council asked the Property Committee to seek clarification from the City Engineer

concerning his position on this matter. There seems to be some confusion over a 1928 easement given to the City of Council Bluffs to straighten Indian Creek, but which allows the grantor to use the land for "any use or purpose not inconsistent with its use by the grantee."

- Joyful Noise for June will be to raise funds for Kimball Park.
- Beginning on June 2 at 8:30 a.m., church members are encouraged to assist in working on the pathway behind the parsonage.
- Rosie Spangenberg gave a report on the Worship and Music Committee. Hymnals have been purchased and Pastor is to schedule a dedication during a future service. The Faith Team is recommending additional video screens and displays in the sanctuary and Fellowship Hall. The initial estimate is \$1,200 for two projectors, splitter, mounts and cable. August 11 will be the Emanuel Garage Sale. Garage sale funds are to be kept separate from Youth Funds and used for Worship needs such as projectors, additional outlets, covers, etc. Sunday, September 9, 2018 will be "God's Work. Our Hands." Rosie has received orders for 21 shirts so far. September 22 and 23, 2018 will be the Jonathan Rundman Concert. On

November 11, 2018 at 11 a.m., a patriotic program will be held at Emanuel in commemoration of 100 years since the end of World War I.

- Amy Garreans reported that she is recruiting members for the Evangelism and Visitation Committee.
- Pastor passed around the meeting notes from the Faith Team that met May 7, 2018. Included in the minutes is a note that a parking lot sign has been purchased and will soon be placed. The Church Council had approved name changes and sign placement.
- Under old business, the Church Council will be signing up for future coffee hour dates. The church has now received the previously authorized credit cards. The facility's usage request form will need to be amended.
- Motion to by Connie Solon, seconded by Joel Hauschild to adjourn at 8:41 p.m. Approved.
- All reports presented to the council may be viewed by any church member at the church office.

The next meeting with be Monday, June 18, 2018 at 7 p.m.

Thanks for volunteering to mow the church lawn. With ten mowers, we have a

He came to bring peace to those who were far off And peace to those who were near. For through him we all come to God without any fear.




