

Faith Like A Child

I remember Pastor Prescott giving an example of things he had heard from kids. He talked about a child not understanding communion, and they thought it was an intermission for a snack and drink.

Kids notice things and ask questions, and it is our job as a community of faith to help answer their questions, teach them and provide them with an age appropriate way to explore and inspire their faith.

We have wonderful leaders in our Sunday school classes, but it isn't just Steve and Lori Lynn that kids learn from. They see everything that the adults do (positive and negative) and learn from us. Including them in decisions and living out our faith in action is vital for their faith formation and the future of Emanuel.

One thing we can do is ask them to help. Giving them a task makes them feel important and valued.

So what might that look like during worship? It might mean one of our youth greeting the congregation at the start of the service, or a young reader leading a prayer. It might be younger children holding the basket for communion cups, or helping greeters with their duties.

Last month I talked about an area for kids in the sanctuary to help them adjust with Sunday school ending for the summer. We have had some great suggestions and modified some of the plans based on those. We want our kids to feel welcome at Emanuel. They are not small adults and might need some accommodations to make it through a 60 minute service.

During Synod assembly we also heard from teens who feel isolated an alone because often churches ask them to go through classes and requirements for confirmation but then don't offer a way for them to connect after that. They are expected to be "adults" at church, when they are still on a path of discovering who they are and making choices about their future.

We are working on coordinating with Our Savior's and St. John on developing something for the teens all three congregations to connect on a somewhat regular basis. We want the teens to help lead this, so it will be based on their interests and faith, and we don't know what this will look like yet since this is a new development.

Our children and youth at Emanuel are awesome. They ask questions, are talented, excited and love to help. Let's give them every opportunity to expand their faith and be leaders at Emanuel.





Ramblings from the Back Corner

Can You Feel the Seasons Turning? This is one of the hymns we used for the Sunday right before Earth Day. We will be using it again. The lyrics are very thought provoking.

Can you feel the seasons turning, Winds and waves grown wild and strange? Can you feel creation groaning, Fearful of the coming change: Icecaps melting, oceans rising, Homes and habitations lost? Can you feel the seasons turning? Can you count the bitter cost?

Can you hear the creatures crying-Lynx and otter, wolf, and whale? Can you hear the Spirit sighing As her children grieve and fail? Nature's poor, the first to suffer, Pay the price of human greed. Can you hear the creatures crying, Begging us to stop and heed? Can you feel the seasons turning?
Storm clouds gather in the skies.
All around us signs of warning
Bid us open frightened eyes.
Called by God to serve as stewards
Till earth's garden greens and thrives,
Can we learn in time to listen?

Can we turn and change our lives?

Mary Louise Bringle, who wrote the above hymn, was born in Tennesee and grew up in Greensboro, North Carolina. She studied French and religious studies at Guilford Collage and got her PhD in theological studies at Emory University. She had a research fellowship from the Alliance Francaise de Newy York at the Institut de Sciences et de Theologie of the Institut Catholique de Paris. She taught at St. Andrews Presbyterian College and now teaches environmental theology at Brevard College. She began writing hymns in 1998, has won international hymnwriting competitions, and was recognized as an emerging text-writer by the Hymn Society. She has more hymns in our new supplement hymnal, *All Creation Sings*, than any other writer.

Green Mountain College in Poultney, Vermont, asked Mary Louise to write a hymn to accentuate the institution's commitment to environmental sustainability. Since they are a Welch heritage college, they asked her to find an upbeat Welsh hymn tune to use. Bringle says this of her hymn:

"I began searching for Welsh tunes not already overused and was taken by LLANSSANNAN. With its rather mournful air, however, I knew it would not work for an 'upbeat' text. I kept hunting. The tune would not let me go. The more I listened to it, the more words started taking shape: 'Can you feel the seasons turning, winds and waves grown wild and strange?' The rising cadence on the third melodic line seemed to cry out for 'ice caps melting, oceans rising...' I teach environmental theology at Brevard College and look with some frequency at lists of endangered species whose 'homes and habitations' have been threatened by human activity. Such lists include the 'lynx and otter, wolf and whale.'

The more I tried to pull myself away from these endangered creatures and focus on a theme of converted and responsible humans, the more mental blocks I encountered. I simply could not write the requested eco-happy hymn until I had worked through the suffering of nature, which, as environmental theologian Sallie McFague writes, has become 'the new poor,' the first to pay the price for our greed and wastefulness. Just as not a sparrow falls but God is aware of the loss, so I feel sure the Holy Spirit grieves and sighs when any one of Her creatures suffers.

In the final stanza of this text I found myself shifting from the literal 'turning' of meteorological seasons as a result of climate change to a hoped-for or metaphorical 'turning' or transformation of human behaviors as we begin to own up to our responsibilities. I have written a few different versions of this closing stanza, the most recent in response to a request from John Ambrose for a text to use as part of the 2015 Hymn Society festival in New Orleans, titled 'When the Storms of Life Are Raging,' including a commemoration of the tenth anniversary of Hurricane Katrina. This revised version [the one here in ACS] is now my preference for the text."


